

Tips and Tricks

- Registering a new patient? Make sure the treating clinician is a registered staff member on the Site Staff List.
- Save your work! The ALZ-NET Portal logs out users after 20 minutes of inactivity.
- Having trouble navigating Medidata Rave? Review the <u>eCRF</u> <u>Training Module</u> or join ALZ-NET Office Hours for a quick demo.
- DO NOT pre-print ICFs. Print directly from Advarra CIRBI once needed to ensure using correct IRB approved version.
- DO NOT attempt to enroll patients at the same time using different browsers. This will result in registration errors.

Important Reminders

- ALZ-NET is a direct pathway for Medicare coverage.
- In September, ALZ-NET Sites will be able to access their site-level data in real-time in the newly launched ALZ-NET Data Dashboard. Sites are encouraged to preview aggregate Networkwide statistics here.
- ALZ-NET's Data Request Process for access to Network-wide data will be available at the end of 2025.

Opportunities for Sites to Improve Operational Efficiency

- Flag Eligible Patients Early: Set up an internal system to identify potential participants before their visit, especially those already on therapy, to enable real-time consenting and avoid followups.
- Streamline Documentation: Use smart phrases and note templates based on ALZ-NET Case Report Forms to simplify data entry. <u>Preview</u> <u>examples here</u>.
- Leverage Office Hours: Join weekly ALZ-NET office hours to resolve data entry issues and optimize workflows.

New Patient Recruitment Materials – Coming Fall 2025

Frequently Asked Questions

Q. How does ALZ-NET manage patients who receive care at multiple clinics due to travel?

A. The clinic that obtains patient consent and completes the registration in ALZ-NET is responsible for coordinating care across sites. This includes requesting and reviewing medical records from any additional clinics the patient visits, both to ensure accurate data entry and to support best practices in clinical care.

Q. Does ALZ-NET plan to collect blood-based biomarkers?

A. Yes. ALZ-NET plans to add a biorepository component in a future version of the protocol. Sites will be notified via email when this option is available to their patients.







Site Spotlight: LGHP Alzheimer's and Memory Care Penn Medicine Lancaster General Team

What does being part of the ALZ-NET Registry mean to you, and what advice do you have for other sites to help ALZ-NET operations go smoothly?

It gives us great professional satisfaction knowing that we are a part of this national research community in learning more about current therapies for Alzheimer's and potential alternative treatments for this prevalent disease process. It provides us with an opportunity to participate in meaningful work for both our patients and future generations. Patients have been very excited to participate. They feel like they are part of a meaningful and cutting-edge program that is advancing the science of memory care.

What challenges did you overcome when implementing ALZ-NET at your site?

There were initial challenges in onboarding the study since the providers and clinical staff were new to clinical research. The other challenge we encountered here at LGH was access to TRIAD, which led to an influx of queries. We are continuing to work on this with our Research colleagues. Our current challenges are unrelated to enrollment or our patients. The start-up process for our site was difficult at first since we were building a foundation for collaboration between the Memory Care Center and the Research Institute. Since we have built connections between departments, we now have a strong collaborative relationship with the PI and office manager from The Memory Care Center. This collaborative effort with a dedicated PI, clinical staff, and research staff has helped the enrollment process here at LGH. Additionally, we chose to have a virtual SIV with ALZ-NET Operations to create an open forum for questions and the development of workflows. This meeting officially laid the groundwork for us to begin enrolling just one week after the SIV occurred.



What advice do you have for other sites to help ALZ-NET operations go smoothly?

Be proactive in obtaining access to TRIAD, ensure all coordinators receive adequate training for data entry, utilize the weekly ALZ-NET office hours, and prepare an internal checklist for entering all data – this helped immensely! Also, the most beneficial thing at our site has been our well-established communication between our PI, research coordinators, and clinical staff. It is also beneficial to have several up-front meetings with research support personnel so you can each understand each other's roles and workflows.

How has it been enrolling patients?

We have had only positive experiences so far with enrollments. Patients are very interested in this work and learning about outcomes that can potentially help themselves and their families (kids, grandkids, etc). We also have a great relationship with our PI and clinical team at the Memory Care Center, making enrollment more consistent with a direct line to patients. Our PI and clinical staff are just as passionate about research as our own research team and the patients, making enrollment successful so far at LGH.

Support for Sites
